Opportunity Summary

RISE seeks a part-time Bus Driver for the 2022-2023 school year. The Bus Driver is tasked with the responsibility of safely picking up student passengers at pre-determined stops along predetermined routes and safely dropping them off at the student passengers' school. From time to time, the bus driver may be tasked with safely transporting student passengers and/or faculty to special events, such as field trips or sporting events. The bus driver's primary responsibility is to ensure the safety of the passengers and compliance with the school's policies and rules. The Bus Driver will report directly to the Transportation Manager.

How You'll Contribute

- Keep order and safety on the school bus
- Obey traffic laws and state and federal transit regulations
- Recognize and immediately report any unsafe act or condition, bus malfunctions, or needed repairs
- Carefully navigate roads and monitor traffic, weather, and people carefully to ensure the safety of students and faculty
- Complete a pre-route and post-route inspection, including checking the condition of the bus's tires, brakes, windshield wipers, lights, oil, fuel, water, and safety equipment to ensure that everything is in working order
- Maintain a working knowledge of and enforce the school system's rules regarding student conduct
- Treat students respectfully and appropriately in accordance with school policy
- Report disciplinary problems to Transportation Manager and respective parent(s)
- Comply with and ensure passengers' compliance with the school system's procedures, rules, and regulations
- Verify that all students are on the bus before starting each route and after each stop
- Verify that all students are off the bus after the end of each route
- Verify permissions for students going home with other students
- Keep the bus clean and presentable to students and faculty
- Pick up and drop off passengers timely at predetermined locations
- Follow predetermined routes according to the schedule

- Keep track of the amount of fuel used, number of students transported, and miles driven
- Keep the supervisor and dispatch informed of any and all possible delays
- Take care of the needs of children with disabilities and help disabled passengers get on and off the bus

- An ability to continue to calmly operate the bus under stressors
- An ability to readily adjust to accommodate changes in weather, routes, pick-up or drop-off times in a positive and proper manner.
- An ability to use multiple limbs in a controlled manner, hear well, and see clearly.
- Bus driving qualifications:
 - Education: High school diploma or GED preferred
 - Experience: 1+ years of school bus driving experience preferred; 2+ years of experience working with children preferred
 - Training/Licenses: CDL license required with passenger and school bus endorsements; basic first aid and CPR certification
 - Background: No at-fault traffic accidents in the last 5 years; exemplary driving record (no traffic citations in last 5 years); no relevant criminal history; ability to pass unannounced drug-testing.
